At our next meeting we will be presenting nine more Guardian Certificates to one of our members. To me this is one of the highlights of our meetings. I hope you are as proud of this as I am. Guarding the final resting place of our Confederate Heroes is one of the most noble and rewarding aspects of being in the Sons of Confederate Veterans.

What I want to talk about this month is how we came to have the Guardian Program in Texas.

Back in 1993 The South Carolina Division instituted a program called the Guardian Program. Its aim and intention was to acknowledge, not reward, those compatriots who went beyond the call of duty to care for and honor our Confederate hero's final resting places. A few years later the National Guardian Program was formed using the same criteria that South Carolina had formulated. The National program is

for States that do not have a program or those that live outside of the States (yes we have Confederates that are buried in other countries).

In 2012 I talked to then Division Commander Granvel Block about Texas forming our own Guardian Program. He was very receptive as well as the Division Executive Committee. It was approved and you know who was appointed as chairman. I began the process of developing an application, certificate and the designing of a medal to present to Full Guardians. The medal itself is identical to South Carolina except the word Texas is used in place of South Carolina. We also used a black ribbon attached to the medal. The words around the medal are "SCV Guardian Texas" and on the bottom "Final Bivouac". The Rules and Guidelines are almost identical to those used by South Carolina. I did not do all this by myself; I had help from Compatriot Dennis Todd, then Chairman of the National Guardian Program. I still rely on his knowledge and expertise. Compatriot Todd was one of the Founding Fathers of both the South Carolina and National Guardian Programs.

We here in Texas have a good and sound program. We now have 391 completed applications on file. I am very proud of what our camp and the Texas Division have

accomplished in these few short years. I urge you to keep up the good work and always remember "It is your duty to insure that the true history of the South is preserved for future generations".

As I always say, I believe with all my being in the Guardian Program and I hope that in some small way I can convince you of its importance in fulfilling "The Charge". We must, now more than ever, show the world that we care about our Southern Heritage and the Valiant Heroes that fought to preserve it.

As always I leave you with this question:

Are you a Guardian? If not, why not?



The "just man" rises, again and again when he falters; because he understands finishing the task is the most important thing to do at the moment. No matter what happens, the Lord has promised to sustain us:


"We are troubled on every side, yet not distressed ; we are perplexed, but not in despair; perplexed but not persecuted but not forsaken; cast down, but not destroyed."
